# Birthplace of Sound on Film

Explore the history of the Case Research Laboratory, the Birthplace of Sound on Film. 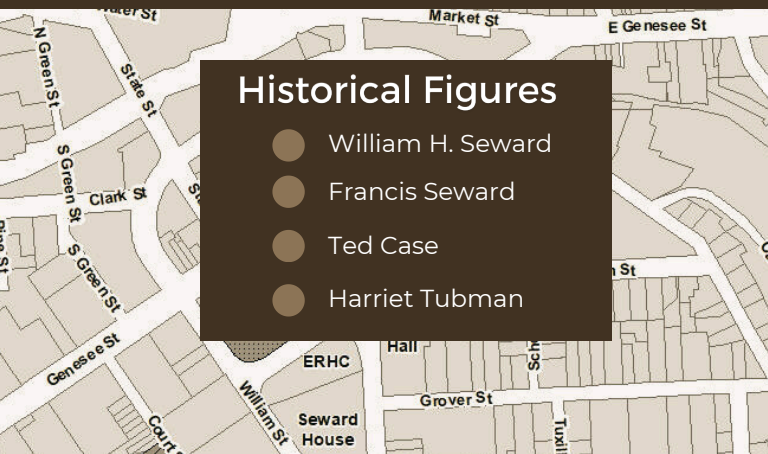
